Battle lines were drawn at a lively meeting of the Parish Council in February, when around fifteen villagers, who live near the Memorial Crescent, lobbied the Council for the removal of the flagpoles that have been there since Remembrance Day. There were strong feelings expressed from both sides of the argument. A few preferred the poles to be left up permanently pointing out the Memorial is for the whole village not just those that live by it, but they were in the minority at the meeting.

It was confirmed by the Parish Council that it has a licence to fly the flags all year round if they so desired but this didn't seem to win much favour on the night.

A great British compromise was eventually reached, so for a trial period the poles will be erected for the flying days by the Parish Council (see page 6 for dates) and taken down by the residents local to the Memorial Green.

Beyond the Whinge - the Editor's blog

If you needed further proof that the Country has gone crackers, it's the revelation that drivers moving out of the way for emergency vehicles to pass are being fined, courtesy of traffic enforcement cameras, if they stray even momentarily into a bus lane, that most hallowed of grounds.

The decision to prosecute of course has been taken out of the hands of humans by using these cameras. So if you behave like any decent human being and divert albeit briefly into a bus lane, yellow box or edge through a red light to let one of these vehicles pass, you can expect a hefty fine through the letterbox in short order as a thank you.

Of course 'safety' cameras throughout the land are considered cash cows by the powers that be, and in my experience seldom have to do with road safety. Bus lane cameras are often operated by local authorities and private firms on behalf of same, and are making killings from these grossly unfair fines. So be warned, next time an ambulance is roaring up behind you on the Botley Road, think on. These cameras have removed common sense from the traffic rules. By law, drivers should only move into a bus lane when directed by a police officer in uniform, if you can find one of course, but that's a whinge for another day.

Even after she had given up creating art herself, greatly enjoyed sharing ideas with fellow artists. In her younger days she was also a very dynamic art teacher in primary and secondary schools, and for many years taught art classes in her studio to both adults and children. She and her husband Robert retired to Kingston Bagpuize from Faringdon and settled into village life with their small dog, Megan. Even when her health was poor, particularly after Robert's death in 2013, Juliet could be seen out walking with the dog, and animals were always a great inspiration for her art work.

Her children, Jeff and Kate Dyer, would like to thank the many friends, neighbours and service providers in the village that helped Juliet in her declining years. In particular, staff at the Post Office and at the Hinds Head who went out of their way to make things easier for her where they could. FEEL LIKE EATING OUT TONIGHT? No: 23. The Packhorse Eating Inn, Steventon

For a long time now I have heard how good this hostelry is, so I was pleased when I had the opportunity to try the fare.

We in fact called when passing to book a table for four for 7.30pm a couple of nights hence.

So things didn't start well when we arrived at 7.35pm to be told the table had been booked for 7.00pm. Ummm....an omen methinks. No matter, we proceeded to our table, noting how full

the restaurant was for a Wednesday night, albeit running up to Christmas. In fairness, the waitress, Kathryn, did warn us that there would be some delays as they were so busy, along with a list of dishes that were off the menu. However, the wait for her to take our order was bad enough but we seemed to go from here to eternity waiting for the starters to arrive.

Here I have to say Kathryn was worth her weight in gold. She said it would be slow and if we needed her to just call or snap our fingers.

The starters arrived, less one they had just run out of, and a second choice was substituted. I went for the black pudding with a slice of bacon and an egg. Delicious to be honest. Proper food, the kind that we ate when we had an empire.

Eventually the main course turned up and it looked good. Unfortunately it was mostly cold but when Kathryn hove to and asked if all was OK I informed her of the temperature deficiency and the offending dish was whisked away.

I had ordered the rib-eye steak with accompanying mushroom, fries, peas, baby tomatoes etc. In fairly short time a replacement was brought to the table with extra onion rings, tomatoes, a new steak also with extra fries and profuse apologies. Whatever they are paying Kathyrn isn't enough.

Alas, the steak was mainly uneatable through the amount of gristle but by now I had given up. The bride had what she described as the worst meal she had ever had. This was tasteless hard salmon cold everything else. She gave up before me and just wanted out. Nobody wanted puddings especially as again several were off the menu. Again Kathryn appeared and offered us coffee on the house for our troubles.

Kathryn is being let down by poor management here. Rarely have I seen a waitress under so much pressure and keeping her cool. What a disappointment. I can only assume the Eating Inn or Packhorse as it is also known has changed hands since achieving the glowing reports I have received in the past. The total cost of this debacle was just over £75 for four including a very acceptable bottle of Malbec, so you couldn't argue with the price, practically everything else though. So we shan't be 'Eating Inn' for a while. Eton Lovett



THE KBS NEWS WINE LIST: WINES OF THE MONTH

Hopefully the snow will have finished and we will just have the March winds to contend with and what better way to cheer you up than a nice bottle of Shiraz. The bottle we have chosen is called The Last Stand Shiraz from the McLaren Vale in Australia. Premium quality fruit and mature vines have produced a wine with great balance, length and fruit intensity. Dark cherry and plum dominate the nose with hints of spice, these flavours carry on to the palate and integrate nicely with the soft, supple, savoury tannins.

Unlike a lot of wines from the McLaren Vale, known for its heat, this wine is sourced from the cooler subregions of Seaview and Kangarilla, which sit under the Southern Mount Lofty Ranges and are renowned for producing some of Australia's best Shiraz. The bottle came from The Oxford Wine Company, priced at £8.69. On the other hand, if you prefer white wines, particularly at a reasonable price, then do try the Italian Pinot Grigio Del Veneto 2013, from Lidl at £4.49. This wine is pale yellow in colour and has a pleasant bouquet elegantly balanced with notes of citrus and a hint of fruit, and is a most enjoyable wine. Cheers, *The Wine Quartet*


To celebrate Valentine's Day, the children made some lovely cards. It might not have been romantic, but it was definitely good fun.

ED VAIZEY MP Parish Newsletter

A subject which I know is close to the hearts of many of my constituents is Community Pubs. Since the Localism act brought in the right to bid, people across the country have nominated around 600 pubs which have then been listed as Assets of Community Value. These are assets – land and buildings

-that are important to the community and have traditionally been used by the community. Once submitted if the asset comes up for sale a special window is opened to give the community the chance to buy the asset before it goes on the open market. Pubs have proved to be the most listed type of asset! By the end of March the Government is planning to bring forward more legislation so that in future when a pub is listed as an Asset of Community Value a planning application will be needed for a change of use or demolition. Any planning application will be considered in the light of national policy as well as Neighbourhood Plans. Hopefully this will lead to 1000's more of our most valuable pubs becoming Assets of Community Value and retain them at the heart of our communities.

Screening films is also another fantastic way to get communities and people from all walks of life together. A new project has been designed by the British Film institute and funded by the National Lottery to support groups launching and running their own Community Cinema. It aims to bring the cinema experience to more people across the UK particularly those who are unable to enjoy regular screenings because of social and economic reasons or simply because they live too far from the cinema. This project includes advice on how to actually start up a cinema, funding, licencing and how and where to book films. Details can be found at www.neighbourhoodcinema.org.uk it is well worth looking at if this is an idea which interests you and your friends and neighbours.

Scam postcards are being delivered to UK residents' homes claiming that a parcel containing "jewellery" is waiting for the homeowner.



The personally addressed postcards say:

"The office is attempting to reach you. To claim this parcel and accept this offer, you must telephone the number below immediately and arrange for a delivery. The item is prepaid, but a processing and delivery fee of £10 must be remitted. This fee can be paid only by telephone and only with a credit card (VISA or MasterCard). This is your only notification"

If you call the 020 number you are asked to pay £10 by credit card. Victims who have reported this to Action Fraud have said that the automated service told them the package would be delivered the same day, but did not receive anything.

Action Fraud has received several reports of this recently occurring fraud and this information has been assessed by National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) resulting in disruption of the fraudster's phone number. Also be on the lookout for slight variations of this scam - which use different phone numbers and delivery items. If you receive one of these delivery cards, do not pay any money and report it to Action Fraud by calling 0300 123 2040 or by using the online reporting tool.

Logs for Labour: Would you like free firewood, or do you have a woodland that needs managing? NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

The February meeting of the KBS Parish Council took place on Monday 2nd February in the Village Hall together with 25 members of the Public.

Public Participation: 1 Several residents of the Oxford Close Area objected to the proposal that flagpoles, forming part of the War Memorial site, should remain permanently erected. A feeling was expressed that they had been excluded from decisions that affected them (although the opportunity to attend Parish Council meetings had always existed, with an agenda published). After a prolonged discussion, (and some heated words between other members of the public), and in the interests of Village harmony, an agreement was reached to accept the offer that the concerned residents would dismount the flagpoles after each event.

2 A group of neighbours from the A415 Abingdon Rd / Oxford Close area have responded to the consultation on a proposed Zebra Crossing pointing out it would be badly sited in relation to the nearby housing. In addition, the proposed design takes no account of current or projected traffic flows on the A415 or traffic from the Faringdon Rd. It is felt that the crossing needs to be pedestrian controlled including a link to traffic lights to control the flow of traffic, otherwise the proposed crossing could prove to be a hazard to pedestrians, rather than a benefit. An OCC cabinet meeting will make a decision in February, and the group will make representations at this time. The parish council has also written supporting the various views on traffic control

3 Complaints were received, yet again, as to the amount of litter and Dog excrement and hazardous items (sharps) on the Old Oxford Rd. The worst section is to the east of the Traffic gate. The VWHDC contractor (Biffa) will be contacted to request a clear up, and the local dog warden advised that previous attempts to rectify the situation have proved ineffective. Perhaps a local litter blitz on the area should be considered with equipment provided by both District and Parish Councils.

4 The issue of the prolonged repair work to the sewer pipe between Fir Tree Close and the Faringdon Rd. was raised. This is causing a degree of inconvenience to many, especially to the elderly, and to parents taking children to school. A meeting with councillors will have occurred by press date. 5 A question was raised as to planning consent for floodlights erected by the Thames Water contractor in the compound in Bellamy Close, which are proving intrusive.

6 Open reach have now installed all the fibre enabled cabinets and the service is expected to be available by June 2015. 7 The issue of training in the use of the Defibrillator was raised. Now arranged for Sat March 14, at 10am. Village Hall.

Report from District and County councillor: Apologies received for absence, and requested any issues in relation to the A420 between Oxford and Swindon be identified to inform a working group which will contribute to the new local transport plan which is being formulated (most of which should be pretty obvious, in that it will not cope with the proposed increase in housing along the area identified. Chair)

Planning: Applications received - NONE Decisions: 13 Norwood Avenue - Refused.

19 Lime Grove - Refused 1 Latton Close - Granted For full details, please refer to February minutes. **Accounts:** Please refer to February minutes for details,

Road Safety: Re last month's complaints re One Stop Stores, a spokeswoman claimed that all deliveries occur after 8am, drivers are considerate to other road users and it was beyond their control to avoid simultaneous deliveries. Residents, who have contrary evidence, please advise the Parish Clerk.

O.C.C. are holding £8K from the development at The Firs, Hanney Rd. Highways had suggested a speed activated sign, with which members saw no value. Further ideas to be sought

Land to be leased or purchased under S106 agreements: There has been no progress with any of the agreements so far this year; the Council's solicitor will be consulted for an update.

Village amenities: Recreation Grounds: General maintenance is required. Burial Ground: Christmas Wreaths to be removed. War Memorial: see public participation as regards flagpole erection and dismounting. Flag flying days for 2015 will be Queen's Birthday 21st April, St. George's Day 23 April, Armed Forces Day 27 June, Remembrance Day / Armistice Day 8/11th November. Recent press coverage has highlighted the apparent lack of recognition of the 70th anniversary of VE Day 8th May 1945. Perhaps the flags should fly then? East Bound Bus stop Latton Close, Concrete wall: A member of the public had expressed concerns over the safety of the block slab wall. Its condition has deteriorated over the years and is considered unsightly, although not immediately dangerous. The Clerk will enter in to consultation with the present owners of the properties concerned with a view to replacement. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 2nd March, in the Village Hall at 7p.m. *Brian Forster, Chair KBS Parish Council*.

Spring gardening tips and talk

March is a wonderful month - longer days and a warmer sun herald spring. There's no excuse not to get into the garden, so these are our top tips for the month:-

Ô Sow seeds for vegetables, using a good seed compost. Germinate

and grow in a south-facing windowsill or greenhouse.

Bats in the Belfry

I once owned an impossibly well-bred, impossibly mad, impossibly impossible thoroughbred ex-racehorse, still described today as one of the most difficult horses ever produced by Barry Hills at his Lambourn yard. I still have a memory of him standing up on his hind legs towering over my I I-year-old daughter on the end of the rope – she kept her head, and a firm contact on the rope, shouting "No Charlie! Get down! Naughty Boy!". - Charlie got down ... Four years ago, when I had my first

lesson ringing full-circle mounted church bells I was struck by the similarities – the huge weight of the bell, the power that could be unleashed, the need for understanding, the right response and above all, the need for good handling and to maintain contact.

Imagine a bell weighing half a ton – and 50 feet of rope – strength has nothing to do with it – you could never control that bell by brute force. You may as well have an elephant on the end of the rope – or a mad exracehorse! In learning to handle your bell well you learn to let the bell do virtually all the work. You learn respect.

The world of the ringer opens up places you would probably never otherwise imagine. I once 'broke in' to Bath Abbey when I heard the bells ringing. Eventually a verger came to ask if I needed assistance, and when I explained that I was a ringer, rather than throw me out he directed me to a 'secret' spiral stairway hidden at the back of one of the chapels. Round and round, up and up and up ... imagine my delight when eventually I emerged onto the roof of the Abbey and looked down into the Roman Baths and over the rooftops of Bath! Picking my way over the lead roof across to the central tower I was welcomed by the ringers. Ten bells, unusually mounted anti-clockwise, with a 33cwt tenor (over 1½ imperial tons) rung, I know she will not mind me saying this, by a diminutive lady with a lovely, welcoming smile. And I rang there — what a privilege!. What an experience! And did you know that the same founder of those bells, Abraham Rudhall, described as the leading founder of his day, cast a ring of five bells for Hinton Waldrist in 1709, of which three still survive?

I did meet a bat in the belfry once, here in Hinton — a pretty little long-eared bat momentarily disorientated by the bright light and my sudden appearance. We looked one another in the eye as he flew round and round, before he recovered his bearings and retired into his dark hideaway in the ceiling.

There are those who say that I am the one who is bats in the belfry. I go up there and the bells tell a history of hundreds of years, they tell a story of pure Englishness – did you know that full-circle ringing is virtually unique to England and is an English invention dating from the I6th Century? These days it has been imitated in a few (mainly) English-speaking countries, but they have nothing like the vast proliferation of full-circle bell towers that we have in this country. Up in the belfry I witness the voices of our villages in ages past – the passage of the Church day at the centre of village life, the Lords of the Manors, the ringers whose peals are celebrated on the peal boards, sometimes revealing enormous feats of stamina – or madness. But the bells get you like that. Their voices are not choked by the frailty of time, but how often today do you hear them chime its passage?. Sometimes the bells have been most eloquent by their very silence, as in WWII, our very Englishness muted, only to be rung to warn of an invasion – or in Victory. Today the bells are still bound to the life of the church, but we also hear them proclaim the joy of our civil celebrations, the Millennium, the Olympics, the Royal Weddings, our Monarch's Diamond Jubilee, the village fete. . . - Or half-muffled they cry out in deepest mourning for our dead.

I am discovering an amazing world – from the bells in the lovely Cotswold churches visited during a recent Branch ringing outing, to the new bell-ringing friends who welcome me wherever I go. Every bell tells a different story. Every bell is a different challenge – and I love it! Bats in the Belfry?? – Not me!

LEARN TO RING CHURCH BELLS – COME AND HAVE A GO! You think it's not for you? You think you have to be very strong? You think you have to be good at maths? Not a bit of it – the adverts on the television could not be further from the real world of bellringing. Come and have a go at full-circle ringing – try it out and see what you really think! The ringers of St Margaret of Antioch in Hinton Waldrist would love to welcome you to try the bells. You don't have to live in Hinton, or even attend church. Bell ringing is for everyone. All ages welcome. There are junior bell ringing as well as adult sessions.

Come and have a tour of the belfry and see the bells. Have a go at ringing. I will soon be arranging a bell-ringing course for beginners which will start with some individual tuition in bell handling. If you would like to learn, or even if you are not sure, please give me a ring and come for a taster session. . . You never know till you try! 
Youth Matters


Scott Thomson writes:

Mark Potts' Kitchen Talk

We have an important occasion at the hotel next month: Mr Lloyd's 100th birthday. We are

Auguste Escoffier ran the Savoy kitchen from 1890-1898, he introduced the brigade system and discipline in kitchens.

The first real celebrity Chef was Marco Pierre White; he earned three Michelin stars at the famous restaurant "Harvey's" at the age of 33 – the youngest ever at that time. His sous chef was Gordon Ramsey. He handed the stars back saying he had no more to achieve. His book "White heat" was recently republished for its 25th anniversary and is a best seller again.

The late 1990's saw molecular gastronomy – Ferran Adria at "El Bulli" used crazy techniques to great affect and was voted best restaurant in the world a record number of times. At one stage he had a ratio of 3 Chefs to every 1 customer. He was Heston Blumenthals main influence when he started the "Fat Duck" in Bray.

The top restaurants today such as Faviken, Noma and L'Enclume are all using methods and techniques from years ago such as fermenting, salt baking and preserving – so it does go full circle. We are all looking forward to trying the different dishes for the birthday on March 7th.


