Replies in response to the concerned resident on Draycott Road (see Oct issue)

We, the current keeper's of the Old English Poplar (not a Lime as you may presume) would like to assure you that the tree has by no means met its demise, in fact we have probably preserved its life for many years to come.

Following the loss of one large bough that fell into our next door neighbour's garden during high winds, we were forced to make it safe before winter set in. Fortunately, our neighbour was not in the garden at the time, but this could have been fatal. At great expense (£3,000) we had the tree heavily pollarded by local professional tree surgeons. This to the great delight of our surrounding neighbours, now brings light into their homes and saves them from sleepless nights when it gets windy.

The 'Lime Grove pollarded stump' will soon be back to its full glory and once again return to the skyline, much nicer than the forever multiplying roof tops that currently keep appearing. These surely should cause more concern than one tree. 9 Lime Grove (not no. 1 as the photograph implied)

I was surprised this evening to see my house photographed twice on page 6 (Oct KBS News). Whilst I somewhat agree with the view of the resident of Draycott road, it is rather short sighted. The pictures published also imply that this is my tree. From what I understand a large piece of the tree actually came down which was a huge concern. The tree was cut down for safety reasons and the degree of cutting down was taken by qualified tree surgeons. I really do not think that these pictures are warranted nor necessary. Maybe some thought should have been taken for the owners of the property who had to take the brutal decision to have the tree cut at great expense and I am sure they wouldn't have done so unless completely necessary. *Madeline Jones*



You know how it is, you just want to nip out for a cheap and cheerful meal rather than go to the trouble of preparing one at home. Usually on these occasions we slip down to the Rose Revived. However as we pulled into the car park a coach was disgorging its clientele in front of us so we thought we would try the Dog House.

Now I haven't been to the Dog House for some time since the staff on that occasion got up my nose, (this is opposed to being in

the Dog House which happens quite frequently) but as they offer the same meal deal as the Rose and I'm partial to the Smoked Halibut Florentine Bake with Spinach and West Country Cheddar, we'd try it again.

It has a cosy and welcoming atmosphere and whereas the Rose Revived tends to be quite busy, the Dog House on this occasion was practically empty save for the Friday evening after work brigade relaxing at the bar after a hectic week helping the economy and paying my pension, thanks guys.

No problem finding a table then, so after the drinks were in and the order placed we mulled over the great deal offered at the Rose Revived, the Dog House and I guess all hostelries in Old English Inns group. Meals from $\pounds 4.99$, I splashed out like a mad thing on the Bake at $\pounds 5.99$ which happily was up to its usual standard.

The staff this time were fine, especially the Dutch waiter from Rotterdam who was extremely pleasant and helpful and who is currently at top of my 'Wasn't he a nice guy list'. So, an agreeable meal, no starters, no puds, no frills and exactly what it says on the tin.

Stories from the natural world at our AGM

Our AGM will be held at our November meeting on Tuesday November 3rd at the Village Hall, 7.15pm for 7.30pm. As well as the usual AGM proceedings there will be wine and nibbles and Becs our Chairperson will host a bit of a quiz / talk about some

fascinating relationships between plants and animals. Members and visitors are most welcome as always. You will be able to re-join / join the club for 2016 at the AGM, or later of course.

Our village is so lucky it has so much going on and lots of active clubs and societies. Keeping both the gardening club and the village show alive and kicking of course requires the people to work together to make it all happen. Being involved is fun, interesting, sociable and rewarding and really need not be burdensome - many hands make light work! Could you be the next new committee member on the gardening club or village show committee? Gardening skills are not a pre-requisite, just a little enthusiasm. So what about the garden? Tidy up leaves, especially from lawns and ponds. Turn your collected leaves into leaf mould, an invaluable soil conditioner: put the leaves in a bin liner (moistening if dry), pierce holes in the bag, then tie the top loosely and stack somewhere out of sight for a year or two. Other jobs for November include planting spring bulbs like tulips, pruning roses to prevent wind rock, sowing broad beans direct for an early harvest, clean out the greenhouse thoroughly, get your bird feeders in place and if all that sounds too energetic, plan your veggie garden from your armchair for next year.

Lastly, our Christmas party planning is well underway. Join us on Tuesday December 1st for a meal, party and entertainment provided by the folk band Three Pressed Men (well worth checking out!). Tickets, £10, will be available at the AGM. Paul Gill, Secretary.

Longworth & District History Society

The Merchant's House in Marlborough was the last summer trip. The house was the home of a 17th century silk merchant. He lived there with his family of 9 children. The building has had several changes of use, the last as a W.H.Smith's shop, before the council bought it to house a museum. As the conversion work started it was realised that the building was important and merited careful conservation. It is now owned by a Trust and guided tours are given by very well informed volunteers.

The first of the Autumn talks was Liz Woolley telling us about "Children at War"; the story of Oxfordshire Children during World War II. Initially children wondered what war was? One little girl understood that there were 2 sides fighting but she thought it might have taken place on a tennis court! Hitler and Mussolini were portrayed in the comics as cartoon characters so it was difficult to understand that it was actually real. Gas masks became a big part of the children's life. They looked like Mickey Mouse, were uncomfortable and were very smelly. As it was important for the mask to fit the child they had to get larger ones as they grew. Public Air raid shelters were built, Anderson shelters were dug into the garden and Morrison shelters were erected inside, often in the front room. Special games were devised to play when in the shelter. Memories of singing songs, especially in the round helped fill the hours spent there. Many families had soldiers billeted on them, or evacuees came from the industrial cities. Malvern School was evacuated to Blenheim Palace. Sometimes there were so many children at a school the day was split by local children in the morning and evacuees in the afternoon. We had an evacuee in the audience and he told us of his journey from East Ham, London via Reading and Uffington by train, then a coach stopping at various villages and he and his brothers were dropped off at Hinton Waldrist, and meeting his 'new family' that he and his brother would live with. They never went back to live in London. It was an amazing evening hearing the history and then a personal history too.

Next meeting: November 19th when Gary Lock will tell us about "Hill Forts of the Ridgeway". Gary is Emeritus Professor of Archaeology at Oxford and is continuing his study of Hill Forts by creating an Atlas of the Hill Forts in Britain and Ireland. The meeting will be held in Southmoor Village Hall, 7.15 for a 7.30 start. All welcome, visitors £3.per meeting, annual membership £10. NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

The October meeting of the KBS Parish Council took place on Monday 5th October in the Village Hall, together with 10 members of the public and County Clr. Melinda Tilley.

Abigail Brown, VWHDC Art Development Officer, gave a presentation on how best S106 monies could be utilised to benefit the village, with what can sometimes be loosely described as art works, to reflect the history and story of the Village.

Public Participation. Questions were raised on the following matters:

Hanney Rd. Why closed on two separate occasions - Highways: Road core samples and clearing of drainage grips.

Road signs obscured by vegetation and road surface (Faringdon Rd / A415 / Little London) Badly Deteriorated. OCC Highways requested to rectify.

Progress with regard to Parish Neighbourhood Plan: Volunteers have been requested in order to form a steering committee, assisted by Cllr Josie Allsworth. Possible sources of finance are being considered. Anything up to £25,000 could be required. Could take up to two years to complete.

A resident claimed that the view that a Parcour Site was desired within the Village was not necessarily the view of many residents within the Village.

Report from County Councillor. Mrs Tilley advised that many issues were at the forefront of discussions and decision making at the County Council. These included a subsidised public transport consultation; Potential Childrens' Centre closures including Southmoor. All this is due to cuts in Central Govt Grant to the County. Further issues include the proposal to close Recycling Centres at both Stanford in the Vale and Drayton. Both strongly opposed by those present and the VWHDC, in that their closure would result in an increase of 'Fly Tipping', and was a required social service which with the ongoing increasing housing and population was a retrograde step, Indeed the increase in houses paying council tax should easily finance the recycling depots.

Report from District Councillor: A written report was submitted by Cllr. Eric Batts.

Local Plan. The First Phase of the public inquiry ended late Sept. This concentrated on SHMA assessment numbers, and the Oxford City unmet housing need. The Inspector should report back in a number of weeks, providing the rationale is considered sound. If so the inquiry will move to the next phase of public examination. The Application for development at Southmoor House has been refused due to a change in Govt. Policy regarding "Affordable Housing". The applicant may appeal or submit a revised app.

5106 Monies: Discussions are on going with a view to securing a resolution.



In Flanders fields.



Mark Potts' Kitchen Talk

There are a few jobs in the kitchen that are perceived to be very difficult but with a few

things to remember are easy to make; one of these is soufflés. The recipe is below:-

250g Fruit Puree

20g Cornflour (Slake with water)

4 egg whites

75g sugar

- 1. Boil the puree; whisk in the cornflour until it comes to the boil again pass through sieve and store in the fridge
- 2. Brush the ramekins with soft butter in an upwards motion then put in the fridge to set. After one hour brush them again and coat with a thin layer of sugar.
- 3. When the fruit mix is cool put it in a metal mixing bowl and whisk until it softens. Whisk egg whites with sugar to soft peaks, it is important that the bowl is clean and that there is no yolk. Fold this into your fruit puree and make sure it is all incorporated. Then fill the moulds and bake at 180 °C, don't open the oven during this time. You are able to use any fruit puree, we are using a damson puree on our current lunch menu.

It appears that only 21% of those entitled to this free check in Oxfordshire are taking advantage of it.

Local lad Matt Chapman racing to the top

My name is Matt Chapman. I live in Southmoor and I'm 15 years old and have lived here all my life. I am currently studying for my GCSEs at Faringdon Community College. I was keen to race karts when I was younger and started at an indoor circuit in Banbury at the age of 11. I joined in regular club meetings and was frequently found toward the front of the races. The owner of indoor track also ran a small team of karts at club meetings at outdoor kart circuits, often based at old airfields. I was invited to try the outdoor karting and took to it very quickly, winning all of my 6 races as a novice driver. Compared to many drivers I was late to start driving, being 12 in my first year of competitive karting, others had been driving since the age of 6 or 7. I wanted to always compete against the drivers at the highest level as I believe this will let me learn from the best drivers and let me see how I rate and how I improve against those drivers. So in my fist year I competed in the national Formula Kart Stars championship in which most competitors were expected to have at least 2 years experience behind them. I raced in the Comer Cadet class achieving several podiums, with the karts reaching speeds of up to 60mph. It was a tough season with poor weather conditions causing havoc with tyre choices. On several occasions we were driving on dry weather slick tyres in the pouring rain, which was like driving on ice.

The following year aged 13 I progressed to a larger more powerful class of kart known as the MiniMax. I even got to race in Spain at an international event. Unfortunately an accident during the season in which I broke my thumb requiring surgery forced me to take a break from the karts. In October 2013 when I was still 13 I entered the Ginetta Junior Scholarship. This was a chance to win a drive in a Ginetta G40 racing car the following year. I was runner-up from 60 candidates. The competition was based on fitness, media skills and driving skills. Being so close to winning the scholarship made me feel I could be competitive and really wanted to be on the grid.

My family supported me and I was able to compete in the Ginetta Junior Championship in 2014. The championship runs as a support race to the British Touring Car Championship (BTCC) the biggest championship series after F1 in the UK. I have raced at 10 circuits around the UK including Silverstone and Brands Hatch in front of crowds of 30,000 people. The races are live on ITV and highlights on the ITV web site.



The cars are rear wheel drive with top speeds of around 120mph. The Championship attracts some of the best drivers of my age up to 17 years old Nationally and Internationally.

I work with a team called TCR which is run by an ex touring car driver Lee Brookes. It is a professional environment with a dedicated mechanic for the car, a race engineer and I work to improve my lap times with Lee by analysing data and video footage from each outing. It was a steep learning curve. But in my first season I regularly finished in the top 10. This year I feel my driving, car control and race craft have improved dramatically. This led to many fastest laps in races and my first podium finish in cars at the final round of the championship at Brands Hatch Grand Prix Circuit. We are now working on the plans for next year. I have options to move up to GT class racing which will be a big step up. It would also mean a chance to add Spa in Belgium to the list of tracks where I have raced. The big challenge with motorsport is funding. I am working along side my Dad to approach companies who may be interested in getting closely involved with the exciting world of motorsport, but in these economic times it is very challenging. I have learnt that the business and media side of the sport is as tough as the racing on the track. Matt Chapman
